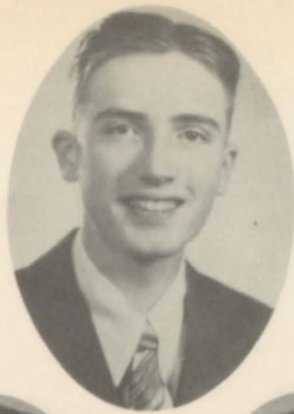
At the halfway mark of the century, the class of '50 pauses to look back over the fun-packed years in CHS and to proudly step into adult living after the climax of graduation.
