Buses will be dismissed through the office as they approach the campus. CFMS Temperature Screening Protocol

- Post signs at all entrances instructing students, staff, and visitors not to enter campus if they have any COVID-19 symptoms. COVID-19 symptoms include fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, recent loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea.
- Students or staff with any identified COVID-19 symptoms and/or a temperature of 100.4 or higher must be sent home immediately until testing and/or medical evaluation has been conducted. Students will be sent to the office conference room to wait until their parent/guardian can pick them up.
- Temperature screenings for students will be done by a paraprofessional or duty teacher each morning. Social distancing dots will be placed on the sidewalks for students to stand on as they wait in line. All

students arriving before 7:20 will enter the building using the glass doors on the south side of the building (side nearest the tennis courts). After 7:20, 6th grade students will enter the building using the glass doors on the south side of the building (side nearest the tennis courts). 7th grade students will enter the building using the glass doors nearest Mrs. Lilly's room. 8th grade students will enter the building using the glass doors nearest Ms. Dorris' room. Upon screening and entering the building, students will report to the cafeteria until 7:30. At 7:30, students will report to their first period class where a teacher will be responsible for watching them. As students enter the building after 7:30, they will pick up their breakfast from the cafeteria and report to their first period class.

- Faculty and Staff will enter the building through the front doors (doors closest to the office) to have their temperature screen each day. Temperature screenings for staff members will be conducted by Ms. Howland or another designee each morning. Staff with any identified COVID-19 symptoms and/or a temperature of 100.4 or higher must be sent home immediately until testing and/or medical evaluation has been conducted.
- Any employee or student leaving campus during the day, must be checked when they return to campus.
