



NOTIFICATION OF HEALTH PRE-SCREENING REQUIREMENT FOR PARENTS (STUDENTS)

To prevent COVID-positive individuals from entering our campuses, Harleton ISD requires all parents to pre-screen their student(s) by asking themselves a set of screening questions. The questions are indicated below. **If you can answer 'YES' to either question, do not send your child(ren) into any HISD campus or facility.** Contact the school and inform us of this information. Upon notification of any positive COVID-19 test, the school will begin its tracing procedures, to determine who, if any, could be affected. Proper and consistent use of face coverings is a major factor in determining close contact.

Have you experienced any of the following symptoms in a way that is not normal for you, which could indicate a possible COVID-19 infection?

- Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
- Loss of taste or smell
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Chills
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Shaking or exaggerated shivering
- Significant muscle pain or ache
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting

Please answer YES or NO.

2. Have you had "close contact" with any individual who is lab-confirmed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

Close contact is defined as:

- a) being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on); or
- b) being within 6 feet for a continuous duration of 15 minutes;
-however, additional factors like case/contact masking (i.e., both the infectious individual and the potential close contact have been consistently and properly masked), ventilation, presence of dividers, and case symptomology may affect this determination.

Either (a) or (b) defines close contact if it occurred during the infectious period of the case, defined as two days prior to symptom onset to 10 days after symptom onset. In the case of asymptomatic individuals who are lab-confirmed with COVID-19, the infectious period is defined as two days prior to the confirming lab test and continuing for 10 days following the confirming lab test.
