SUMMARY

This position teaches and coaches our students to the highest level that can be attained, while supporting the academic beliefs and practices of the district.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skills and abilities required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Determines appropriate actions within clearly defined guidelines.
2. Presents a positive image of the school to parents, and conveys the district's genuine concern with the education, growth and development of each student.
3. Seeks to establish friendly and cooperative partnerships between home and school.
4. Works to develop a positive public relationship between the school district and community.
5. Carries out assignments in a timely manner.
6. Reacts positively to directives.
7. Willingly cooperates with faculty, staff, Principals and district Administrators.
8. Strives to maintain and improve professional competence.
9. Takes necessary precautions to protect students, equipment, materials and facilities.
10. Understands, models and implements the code of ethics with all students and colleagues.
11. Adheres to Board of Education Policies and Procedures.
12. Supervises all fund-raising activities.
13. Keeps accurate records on budget expenditures.
14. Prepares an annual report highlighting accomplishments, awards, participation levels and recommendations for improvement.
15. Possesses knowledge of CPR and First Aid.
16. Possesses knowledge of blood borne pathogens and other infectious materials and the procedures of dealing with same.
17. Maintains confidential nature of all school-related matters.
18. Performs other tasks and assumes other responsibilities as assigned by the supervisor or Superintendent.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities – Head Coach:

1. Develops drill and practice activities that teach and enhance individual/team skill development.
2. Models/demonstrates activities and equipment used to develop basic skills or physical condition.
3. Observes, diagnoses and prescribes appropriate remediation activities during practice and game conditions for players and team.
4. Knows and applies the developmental stages of each point of the game to the needs and ability levels of the players and team.
5. Assumes responsibility for providing training rules and expectations and seeing that rules are taught to each participant.
6. Assimilates innovations and adapts to changes when applicable.
7. Instructs assistants in techniques necessary to meet the objectives of the sport or activity.
8. Assists in the scheduling of the sport or activity.
9. Assumes responsibility for documenting the requirements for physical examinations, parental consent and eligibility.
10. Promotes student academic achievement and serves as a liaison for post-secondary scholarships.
11. Participates in the hiring of assistant coach(es) under direct supervision.
12. Manages assistant coaches through appropriate selection, assignment of duties and responsibilities, and monitoring of performance.
13. Follows a budget in line with the district's guidelines and expectations.
14. Analyzes and evaluates sports effectiveness.
15. Develops and maintains an inventory list of equipment.
16. Prepares and implements a schedule of checking out, maintaining and checking in equipment.
17. Plans and enforces appropriate safety and health rules and regulations.
18. Develops a supervision plan that ensures the safety and welfare of students at all times, i.e. locker room, trips, practices, games, etc.
19. Assumes responsibility for supervising students on out-of-town activities, which may involve staying overnight.
20. Presents a professional appearance.
21. Communicates effectively with all audiences, i.e. players, officials, parents, supervisors, peers and spectators.
22. Assumes responsibility for public relations with all audiences.
23. Performs other duties related to the position as assigned by the Director of Athletics/Activities.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities – Assistant Coach:

1. Supports and assists the Head Coach as assigned in selected areas above.
2. Performs other duties related to the position as assigned by the Head Coach.

Language

Solve a variety of problems in many different situations. Interpret instructions presented in written, oral, diagram or schedule form.

Identify needs and abilities of individual students and to adapt methods accordingly. Establish and maintain effective relationships with students, peers and parents. Perform multiple tasks simultaneously.

Physical Requirements

The individual who holds this position is regularly required to walk, hear and speak as a major function of the job. Regularly required to speak and hear in an environment where numerous conversations and activities may be taking place simultaneously. Must be able to move around the meeting location. Must have close moderate and distance vision ability. Regularly required to read handwritten or printed material.

Physical requirements also include, but are not limited to, sitting (normal seated position), standing, walking (level or uneven surface), bending/twisting neck, bending/twisting at the waist, kneeling, crouching, crawling, climbing, reaching, lifting (up to 50 lbs.), carrying objects (up to 50 lbs.) while walking, pushing, pulling, presence of heat (summer high temperatures, high humidity, ovens, furnaces, etc.), presence of cold (winter low temperatures, walk-in refrigerator/freezer).

Employee can be expected to help students with their mobility needs.

Hours / Attendance / Travel

Beginning and ending work hours will be established by the supervisor. Consistent and regular attendance is an essential component of student learning. In district travel may be necessary due to grade level configuration.

The individual who holds this position will regularly work in a school environment that is noisy and active. The individual may be required to work outdoors for various periods of time to perform such tasks as supervising class, club or group activities.
