Dear Parent/Guardian of a Sophomore or Freshman at LRHS:

Our mission is to prepare all students for college, career, and life. On **March 3, 2022**, the sophomores and freshmen will be taking the PreACT as one of the first steps in checking their college and career readiness. The results will benefit the student by providing them with a projected ACT score and identifying areas of strength as well as areas where improvement may be needed to reach their college and career goals. The counselors use the data from the PreACT when recommending courses and optional programs students may be interested in pursuing.

Please encourage your student to do their best on the PreACT. These assessments are a great opportunity to practice taking the ACT as well as getting feedback on their ability at no cost to the parent. We are looking for growth over time. This is the reason students take the PreACT as freshmen and then again as sophomores to see the progress being made in college and career readiness.

On March 3rd, students will be taking the Pre-ACT in the morning and the afternoon will be spent introducing the process for selecting courses of interest for the 2022-2023 school year. There are many important choices ahead. We hope you will take an active role in helping your student select courses for next year that will help them achieve their future goals. Students have until March 10th to make their final selections.

College & Career Readiness Day, March 3rd is a big day at LRHS. Please make sure your student has a good breakfast ahead of time since food and drink will not be allowed in the testing area. Our school breakfast menu will include biscuits and gravy on that day. Also, students will need a #2 pencil (mechanical pencils are not allowed on this assessment).
