Tip- use the Big Dipper as your guide on the map. Send a picture to your teacher using your Star Map!</p> <p><u>(OPTIONAL) Constellation circles-</u> Cut out the constellation circles and place on the bottom of a paper cup. Each circle gets its own cup. Use a pin/thumbtack to create holes on the paper and cup. In a dark room, shine a flashlight in the cup to see the constellation on the wall! Tip- if you do not have paper cups, put the circle on the flashlight.</p>

## New Learning

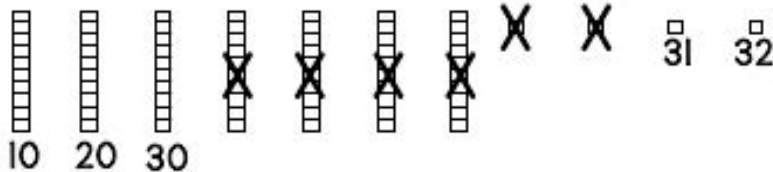
We can subtract a 2-digit number from another 2 digit number.

- Mark out the tens and ones from the second number.
- Then count what is left to find the difference.

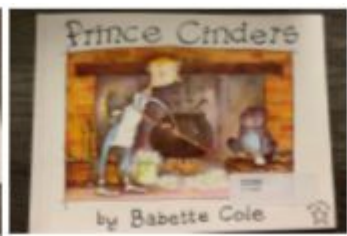

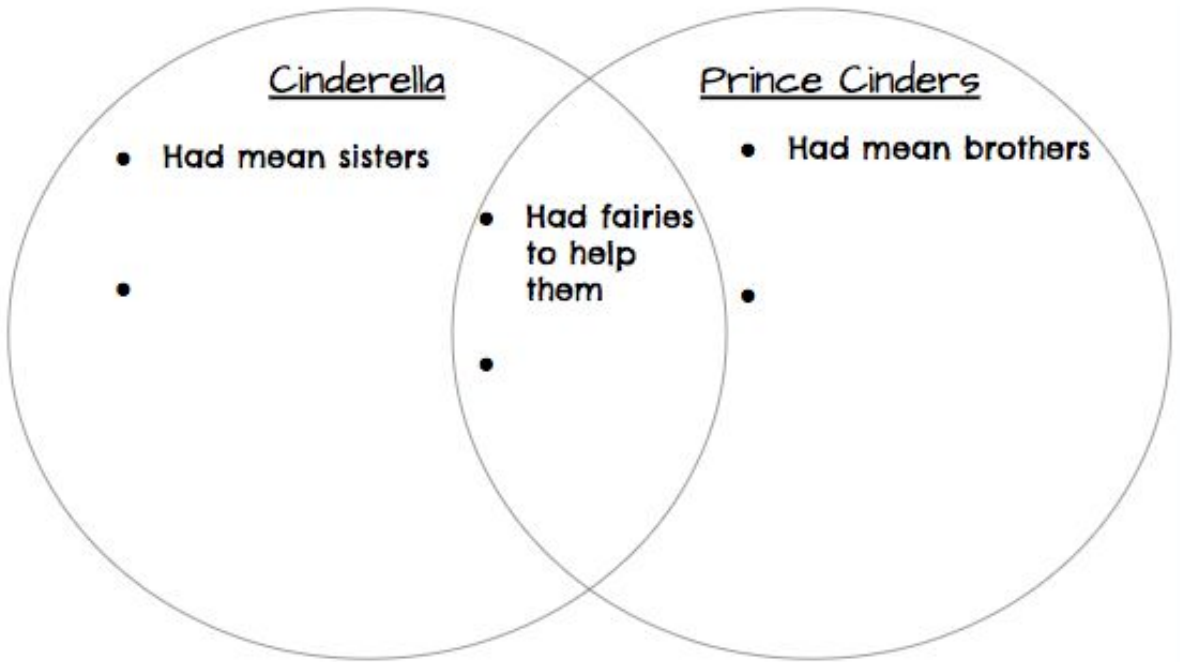

The stars in constellations might look as though they are the same distance from Earth. They are not. Some stars are much closer to us than others.



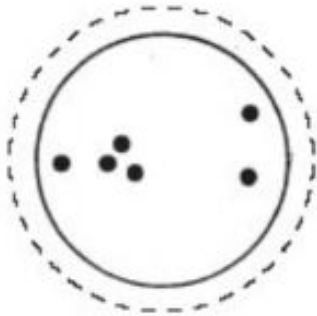
