*An Honor Graduate must have taken a full credit of foreign language.

*Students with a 4.0 or greater grade point average and eight (8) honor courses will graduate with "Highest Honors".

*Students with a 3.5 grade point average up to a 3.99 and eight (8) honor courses will graduate with "Honors".

*To be "Highest Honors", two (2) of the eight (8) required honors courses must be Advanced Placement courses.

AP Program Information:

The Advanced Placement Program and courses enable willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies while still in high school. The program consists of college-level courses developed by the AP Program that high schools can choose to offer, and corresponding exams that are administered once a year.

PAP Program Information:

The Pre-AP Program offers consistent, high standards in focused courses that help build, strengthen, and reinforce students' content knowledge and skills. Pre-AP courses get students ready for Advanced Placement and other college-level course work. They are designed for ALL students and to be the standard, baseline course in their particular subjects.
