On everyone's head.

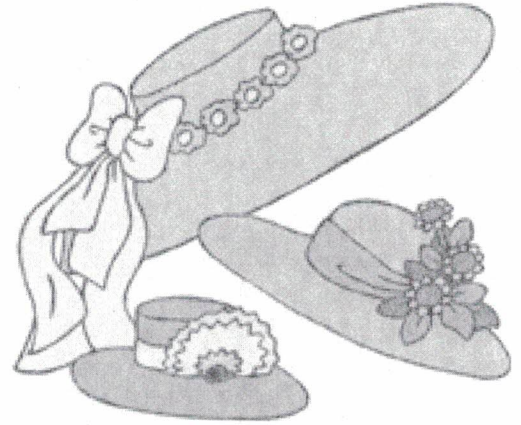
Bonnets with feathers,
