Watch Mrs. Purin show you how to make your own instrument at home!</p>	<p>Brazil: Listen to Fabiana teach you how to sing "Mas Que Nada" from Brazil in Lesson 1. Use your shaker you made to play along.</p>	<p>Brazil: When we listened to "Mama Paqueta" we learned it was a Carnival song. Design your own Carnival Float. Either print it out or draw on your own paper.</p>

She will teach a bit about how to scat.</p>	<p>"Take the A Train" gives instructions on how to get somewhere. Find the worksheet on the website and give directions to a different place.</p>

<p>Mrs. Purin will post a video talking about the recorder basics on the Bethel Music FB page. Another good resource is by a teacher named Mr. Erdogan. I will post a his videos. Here is his Lesson 1: Note "B."</p> <p>On the Bethel Music Website there are several songs to practice on using just one note at a time. Don't forget the rhythms! If you need help with rhythms think of last week's lessons and use "ta" and "ti."</p>	<p>Mr. Erdogan's Lesson 2. Notes "A" and "G." We are prepping for our first song using "B, A, G."</p>	<p>Here is "Hot Cross Buns" with the music notes. You can watch Mr. Erdogan's Lesson 3: "Hot Cross Buns" to see him play!</p>	<p>There are so many songs you can play with "B,A,G."</p> <p>Prep for "Gently Sleep."</p>	<p>Play "Gently Sleep."</p> <p>Don't forget to check out the Bethel Music Website to find more songs with just our first three notes. Review rhythms and note names and next week we'll have more songs to try out.</p>
