The objectives of the Perryville High School for the 2022-2023 school year are to: 1) students will take the ACT for 11th grade and the ACT ASPIRE for grades 7-10 2) students will continue to work with technology to improve understanding of different academic classes 3) continue to design curriculum and professional development activities to improve our educational programs, 4) continue facility improvements which will insure a positive educational atmosphere and safe environment.

Strategies to achieve these objectives will include: 1) development and implementation of a comprehensive improvement plan, 2) expenditure of federal and district funds to hire additional staff to improve literacy and mathematics skills, 3) research and design professional development activities designed to improve literacy and mathematic skills and strategies that are to be incorporated into the classroom curriculum, and 4) develop procedures for the classroom to improve student learning.

Testing: ESSA score for the 2022 ACT Aspire was above state average at 64.1 (State Average 64.02)

Commitments and goals:

1. Perryville High School's 4 day week school day is scheduled for eight 56-minute periods to maximize the utilization of staff and to provide for opportunities for remediation.
2. PHS will continue the dyslexia program using Phonics First
3. Formative, common assessments are given every quarter in the areas of math, literacy, and science. These assessments are given to continue diagnosis of student learning areas that have not been mastered. The remaining weeks in the quarter are utilized for re-teaching material that was not mastered.
4. PHS will continue to employ a math tutor and an English tutor to be available four days a week for after school tutoring.
5. All teachers will continue to use the Arkansas Department of Education frameworks.
6. PHS teachers will have access to online resources in order to increase the student's vocabulary and increase their writing skills.
7. PHS has implemented Google Classroom in all classrooms.
8. PHS will utilize digital days and technology for any days out due to sickness or weather. Teachers and students will use Google classroom or hard copies for material.
9. PHS is offering distance learning classes of world civilization, composition I and II, college algebra, college math, Western civilization I and II, US History I and II, oral communications and beginning Spanish I and II for concurrent credit.
There are approximately 30 students enrolled.
10. PHS also offers essentials of computer programming with a classroom teacher.
11. We have the following Vocational Programs:

12. PHS has utilizes new tornado shelter/cafeteria
 13. Installed three magnetic lock doors and now have over 40 cameras plus a more secure intercom system.
 14. Installed Four Silent Panic Buttons
 15. Installed a video doorbell for entry into school. All outside doors are locked for safety.
 16. All students will be issued a Chromebook for academic use. All teachers are required to develop a Google Classroom site for each of their classes.
 17. PPE equipment has been purchased for cleaning and health safety, as well as disinfectant foggers.
 18. Students can take classes at UACCM for college credit or technical credit.
