

Student Isolation Payments

EEAA-R

Students who live more than two miles from a school or a bus route providing transportation to school will be considered an isolated student.

Students meeting the criteria established by Wyoming State Statute and Department of Education regulations will be eligible for isolation payments upon presentation of an isolation request to the Board.

The Board will approve isolation payments for one of three actions taken by the student or the student's parents.

Room and board will be provided for students who reside at a place other than their normal residence for the purpose of attending school and not accompanied by their parent or guardian.

A family move will be approved when the student and his family move to a place other than their normal residence in order for the student to attend school.

A mileage reimbursement may be provided for vehicles used in transporting a child or children to and from a bus route or school.

The rate of isolation payments will be established by the Board within the guidelines set by the State Board of Education, and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.
