

Evaluation of Technology Security

The intent of this document is to perform a technical and non-technical evaluation of the technology security policies. This policy applies to all Crook County School District #1 workforce members including, but not limited to full-time employees, part-time employees, trainees, volunteers, contractors, temporary workers, and anyone else granted access to sensitive information by CCSD#1.

CCSD#1 will evaluate the technical and non-technical implementations of its security policies and procedures. This evaluation will be completed on an “as needed” basis, but not less than once a year. The purpose of this evaluation will be to determine the effectiveness of the policies as well as to ensure compliance with state and federal regulations. This evaluation will occur annually, as well as when any of the following events occur:

- There is a change to any state or federal regulation that may affect these policies.
- There is a new state or federal regulation that may affect these policies.
- There has been a signification breech of security or other security incident within Crook County School District #1.
- Any other time the superintendent, technology coordinator, or business manager feels there is a need to evaluate the CCSD#1 security policies.

Should a policy or procedure be found to be ineffective, missing, or otherwise flawed, CCSD#1 will amend or add the policy or procedure in a timely manner.

The superintendent will be responsible for ensuring the implementation of the requirements of this policy. Failure to comply with this or any other security policy may result in disciplinary actions. Legal actions also may be taken for violations of applicable regulations and standards such as state and federal rules to include the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
