

Programs for At-Risk Students

Students "at risk" in Wyoming are defined, according to State Board of Education Rules and Regulations, as a student who exhibits behavior that places the child at risk for school failure.

The Superintendent shall promulgate procedures within the District to identify and provide intervention services for "at risk" students.

The District will provide instruction, when appropriate, through the school curriculum directed at the prevention of "at risk" behavior. Schools will develop and implement any additional "at risk" prevention programs to meet the specific needs of their respective student populations.

District residents and personnel shall be involved in the development of procedures, services, and curriculum strategies to be utilized with "at risk" students.
