

## Student Conduct

## JFC-R

The principal may suspend or recommend expulsion, for up to one year, of a student who violates one or more of the following standards of conduct while on school grounds, during a school-sponsored activity or during a school-related activity:

1. Causes or attempts to cause damage to school property or steals or attempts to steal school property;
2. Causes or attempts to cause damage to private property or steals or attempts to steal private property;
3. Causes or attempts to cause physical injury to another person, except in self-defense;
4. Possesses, uses, transmits or is under the influence of any narcotic drug, hallucinogenic drug, amphetamine, barbiturate, marijuana, alcoholic beverage, vapor pen, intoxicant or tobacco of any kind;
  - a. **Tobacco:** A first violation shall result in a one-day in-school suspension; a conference with the principal, parent or guardian, and the student; and exclusion from participation in all interscholastic activities, excluding local meetings, for a period of 14 (fourteen) calendar days or 2 (two) contests, whichever is longer. (Refer to training rules for action taken against the student as an athlete.) A second violation of the above rule shall result in in-school suspension of a student for up to 4 (four) days and from participation in all interscholastic activities, excluding local meetings, for 70 school days. A third violation of the above rule will result in up to a six day out-of-school suspension and/or expulsion from Crook County schools for up to one year.
  - b. **Alcohol:** A first violation shall result in an in-school suspension of the student for 3 (three) days and from participation in all interscholastic activities, excluding local meetings, for a period of either: [1] thirty-six calendar days; or [2] a reduced suspension consisting of 14 calendar days (no competition or 2 (two) contests, whichever is longer), if a confession is made prior to the next school day to a coach or administrator. A second violation of the above rule will result in an out-of-school suspension for up to 7 (seven) days, suspension from participation in all interscholastic activities, excluding local meetings, for 70 school days, and/or expulsion from Crook County schools for up to one year.
  - c. **Other Illegal or Controlled Substances:** A first violation of the above rule will result in up to 10 (ten) days out-of-school suspension, suspension from participation in all interscholastic activities, excluding local meetings, for 70 school days, and/or expulsion from Crook County schools for up to one year.
5. Continued willful disobedience or open and persistent defiance of proper authority;
6. Behavior which is inimical to the welfare, safety and morals of other students.

The superintendent, pursuant to 21-4-305(a), shall expel from school for a period of one (1) year, any student determined to possess, use, transfer, carry or sell a deadly weapon as defined under W.S. 6-1-104(a)(iv) within any school bus as defined by W.S. 31-7-102(a)(xl) or within the boundaries of real property used by the district primarily for the education of students in grades kindergarten through twelve (12). The superintendent, with the approval of the board of trustees, may modify the period of expulsion on a case-by-case basis based upon the circumstances of the violation or violator. Violators will be referred to law enforcement agencies.

Penalties for multiple violations shall run consecutively. The principal will have these rules printed in the student handbook or other publication and have them made available to students and parents.
