

Title I Parent Involvement

The Crook County School District #1 Title I Program recognizes the importance of parent involvement in schools. Title I places a high priority on working with parents and families to provide the best possible education for each child in the program.

Research has shown that parents who participate in their child's education make critical contributions to their child's academic achievement. Therefore, it is the consensus of the Title I Program that every school building providing Title I services to students will involve families in the education of children.

Because of this belief, involvement will have the following components. The district will:

- Involve parents in the Title I Plan (Consolidated Grant Application);
- Assist schools in parent involvement activities to improve student academic achievement;
- Build capacity for parent involvement;
- Coordinate parent involvement with other programs such as Head Start and Even Start; and
- Conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual review of the policy.

Because of this belief, involvement will have the following components. Each school will:

- Have an annual review meeting of Title I parents;
- Have a school/parent/student compact;
- Be flexible when scheduling meetings, providing ample opportunities for parents to meet;
- Encourage Title I parents to be involved in the general education process; and
- Have provisions to give information to parents in a timely manner about their children's assessment results, school performance, teacher qualifications, and curriculum information such as levels of proficiency.

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
