## MRS. JOHNSON WAS AWARDED

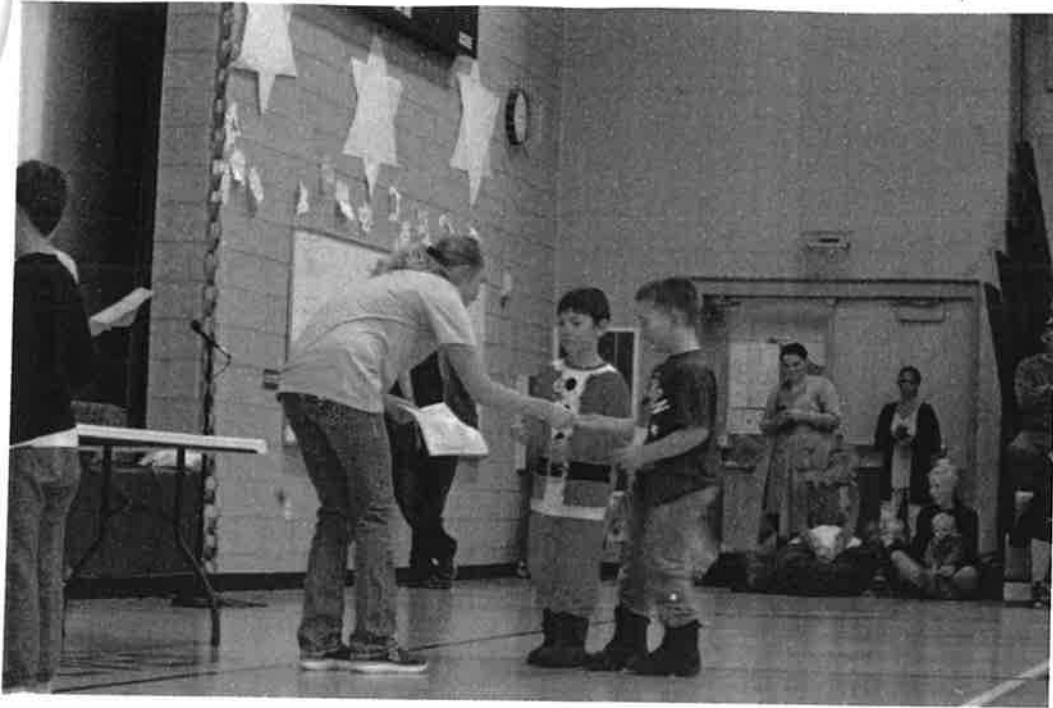
