

Category 1 - MINOR RULE INFRACTIONS

INFRACTION DEFINITION	EXPECTED BEHAVIOR	CONSEQUENCES
KISSING/PUBLIC DISPLAY OF AFFECTION: to kiss or hold hands or hug in public	Students shall not engage in kissing and/or public displays of affection. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
PROFANE LANGUAGE: use of any language, verbal or non-verbal, that shows irreverence or is vulgar.	Students shall use acceptable language at all times during school and all school activities. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
LITTERING: Any leaving or scattering of trash around school property.	Students shall help keep the Chugwater School building and grounds free of trash. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
LOITERING: To linger without school sponsored purpose.	Students will leave Chugwater School by 4:00 each day unless they have made prior arrangements with a teacher, sponsor, coach, or the principal.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS: Any clothing that does not follow the dress code policy is considered in violation.	Students should dress and groom appropriately according to the Chugwater School dress code policy. Parents will be contacted.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
WEARING HATS IN THE BUILDING:	Chugwater School students will be required to take their hats and head gear off when they are in the building.	<i>Hats may be taken away by Faculty/Staff for the entirety of the day only</i>
TARDIES: When you are late for your assigned class. See appendix on Tardies	Students are to get to all assigned classes in the time allotted. *See the note at the bottom of the page.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
TRUANCY: An unexcused absence.	Students will participate in and contribute to their educational success by attending school regularly. Parents will be notified and police will be contacted.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
OUTER GARMENTS, BACKPACKS, BAGS, AND SHOES: Outer garments, backpacks, and bags must remain in your locker during the school day. Shoes must be worn at all times.	Students are expected to keep outer garments (coats, pullovers, sweatshirts, etc.) in their lockers during the school day and wear their shoes at all times. Parents will be contacted.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
HANDBOOK VIOLATION: Any non-compliance with school policy outlined in the Handbook.	Students are expected to comply with all school and board policies.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
POSSESSION OF WEAPONS: Knowledge or possession of any weapon, instrument, or device such as knives, or similar objects, without intent of malice.	Students shall not be in possession of any knife or device which may be considered a weapon.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences

Category 2 - MODERATE RULE INFRACTIONS

INFRACTION DEFINITION	EXPECTED BEHAVIOR	CONSEQUENCE
HARRASSMENT/DISRESPECT: Any disrespectful behavior toward other staff or students including name calling, teasing, provoking, or threatening.	Students are expected to treat other students and staff with respect at all times while at school or any school activity. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
INSUBORDINATION: Open and/or repeated defiance to authority	Students shall follow directions given by school personnel. Students and parents will also be requested to attend a conference with the parties involved.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
SEXUAL HARASSMENT: Sexual harassment is any activity of sexual nature that is unwanted or unwelcome, but not limited to, unwanted verbal comments of a sexual nature, sexual name calling,	Students are expected to treat others with respect on or off school premises as well as all school sponsored activities. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences

pressure to engage in sexual activity, or repeated propositions.		
USE OR POSSESSION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND SUBSTITUTES: Any student who has tobacco products and/or substitutes or is found using tobacco products.	Chugwater School students shall not use or hold tobacco products or substitutes at any time. Under age students (17 and under) may be referred to the police. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	*Superintendent will be notified in each case.
MISLEADING PERSONNEL/CHEATING: To deceive, to lead or guide with dishonest intentions including, but not limited to: false notes or phone calls, tampering with tests, copying others work as your own, attempting to receive credit for work you did not do, cheating on a test.	Students are expected to be honest and truthful at all times. Students and parents may be required to attend a conference with parties involved. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
MISSED ADMINISTRATIVE/DETENTIONS: To not go to a scheduled administrative detention without first making arrangements with the teacher or principal.	Students are expected to complete all detentions when scheduled. If an emergency situation occurs, students should make other arrangements with the principal or teachers. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences

Category 3 - MAJOR RULE INFRACCTIONS

INFRACTION DEFINITION	EXPECTED BEHAVIOR	CONSEQUENCES
FIGHTING: Both parties participating in a physical exchange, with intent to harm.	Students shall settle differences by non-physical means. Students and parents will be required to attend a conference with parties involved. Students may be charged with breach of peace and taken to court.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
HAZING: Any act of or coercing another, including the victim, to do any act of initiation unto any student or other organization that causes or creates a substantial risk of causing mental or physical harm to any person.	Students are expected to treat others with respect. Parents will be contacted in all cases.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
VANDALISM: Deliberate, mischievous, malicious destruction of property.	Students are expected to respect the personal property of other students, staff, guests, and the school. Students and parents will be required to attend a conference with the parties involved.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
THEFT: Any wrongful taking of property of another person or the school district.	Students are expected to respect the real or personal property of the other students, staff, guests, and the school.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
SEXUAL ASSAULT: Sexual assault is any activity of a sexual nature that is unwanted or unwelcome, including but not limited to unwanted touching, pinching, patting, and unwanted body contact.	Students are expected to treat others with respect on or off school premises or at all school activities. Students and parents will be required to attend a conference with parties involved. Students may be charged with sexual assault and taken to court.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
SEXUAL MISCONDUCT: Any sexually related behavior which is judged to be clearly detrimental to the education, welfare, safety, or morals of another student.	Students will not engage in sexually related behavior while on school property or under the supervision of any school personnel. This rule applies to all students while at school or attending any school activity in town or out of town. Parents will be contacted.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
ALCOHOL: Possession, distribution, or being under the influence of alcohol.	Students are expected to make healthy choices and adhere to the law. Parents will be contacted and police will be notified.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE: Possession of, under the influence of, conspiracy to possess or distribute, or possession of paraphernalia of a	Students are expected to make healthy choices and adhere to the law. Parents will be contacted and police will be notified.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences

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Category 4 - BOARD ACTION

INFRACTION DEFINITION	EXPECTED BEHAVIOR	CONSEQUENCES
CONTINUED WILLFUL DISOBEDIENCE: Deliberately failing to obey rules and/or instructions of the staff	Students shall follow the rules and instructions established at Chugwater School.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences.
THREATENING THE SAFETY OR INTENDING TO HARM OTHERS: Behavior that is clearly detrimental to the education, welfare, safety, or morals of others.	Students will respect each person's right to a safe, secure learning environment, free from danger, injury and damage.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
POSSESSION OF WEAPONS: Knowledge or possession of any weapon, instrument, or device such as guns, knives, or similar objects, which may be considered a threat to the safety of others.	Students shall not be in possession of any firearm, weapon, or device which may be considered a weapon.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences
ANY BEHAVIOR THAT IS IN THE JUDGEMENT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD, CONSIDERED TO BE DETRIMENTAL TO THE EDUCATION, WELFARE, OR MORALS OF THE SCHOOL.	Students shall allow other students the opportunity to learn successfully without fear for their welfare or safety.	See Discipline Code Behavior Consequences

RESOLUTION

The Principal shall have the authority and discretion to deviate from any progressive disciplinary code contained in this handbook, if in the opinion of the Principal such deviation is justified because of circumstances. In such cases, the Principal can impose a suspension or recommend expulsion of that student.
