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2. **Brock ISD PEIMS Financial Standards Reports-** The financial sections of the Texas Annual Progress Report (TAPR) is provided by the Office of School Finance. These reports can be accessed from a link on the last page of the district's TAPR. The 2016-2017 Financial Actual Report summarizes revenue, expenditures, and the fund balance. Brock ISD's General Fund Unassigned Fund Balance is \$2,566,301.00. Released by TEA, December 1, 2017: Created by the 77th Texas Legislature in 2001, the School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) is designed to encourage public schools to better manage their financial resources to provide the maximum allocation possible for direct instructional purposes. The 2016-2017 ratings are based on annual financial reports provided to TEA by districts and charters from the 2016 fiscal year. The financial accountability system requires TEA to review the audited financial reports from all districts and charters.

The FIRST ratings are based on 15 financial indicators, such as administrative cost expenditures; the accuracy of a district or charter's financial information submitted to TEA; and any financial vulnerabilities or material weaknesses in internal controls as determined by an external auditor

Based on the submitted information, a school district or charter is assigned one of four possible letter grades (A, B, C or F), as well as a coinciding financial management ratings – *Superior, Above Standard Achievement, Meets Standard or Substandard Achievement*.

The rules also establish accreditation standards and sanctions, including definitions, purpose, and oversight appointments.

Campus performance objectives were approved by the Board of Trustees during the Oct. 9, 2017 board meeting. Progress towards meeting performance objectives is measured and documented quarterly.

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Violent Criminal Incidents on Campus cont. - Safety/Health & Wellness: Brock ISD maintains a secure perimeter at all campuses through controlled entry points and electronically locking or manual locking external doors. Visitors are buzzed into the buildings on the Jr. High and High School campuses. Visitors at the elementary are screened using a visitor management system (system is located on all three campuses) and then buzzed into the school's main hallway. All three campuses have security cameras. Campuses regularly conduct drills based on a Standard Response Protocol. A district and campus triannual safety audit was conducted and reported September 2017.

Brock ISD has one School Resource Officer (SRO). The SRO brings specialized knowledge of the law, crime trends, and safety procedures to the campuses, supporting our educational mission. The district also uses trained dogs to alert district officials to the presence of prohibited or illegal items, including drugs and alcohol. At any time, the dogs may be used search property and vehicles on school grounds, including common areas, hallways, classrooms to search lockers and student belongings.

Students in grade 7-12 participating in extracurricular activities or driving on campus will be required to submit to random drug testing. Students and parents must sign a consent form annually agreeing to be subject to the rules and procedures of the drug testing program.

Brock ISD students participate in Fitness Gram requirements, as well as, in multiple state and national campaigns such as Red Ribbon Week, Hannah 4 Hope, Crime Stoppers, and have access to an anonymous bullying and student safety reporting and crime prevention tool on the Brock ISD website. Additionally, our School Health Advisory Council, which consists of community members, parents, health professionals, and district employees provides input into the district's health and wellness education program.

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6. **Student Performance in Post Secondary Institutions (THECB Postsecondary Report)** – This information is provided to districts from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and reports student performance in post-secondary institutions during the first year enrolled after graduation from high school. Student performance is measured by the GPA earned by the Class of 2015 graduates who attended public 4 year or 2 year higher education in the Fall of 2015, Spring of 2016 and Summer of 2016.
