The purpose of this plan is to promote a collaborative culture for parents, teachers, staff, students and community that sustains quality parental involvement and encourages the academic, social and emotional growth of our children. This culture will improve through meaningful communication, parental enrichment activities, volunteerism, support and resources provided through the Parent Center.

Communication: Greenland High School will use various communication strategies to provide additional information to parents and to increase parental involvement in supporting classroom instruction.

1. The Greenland School District website with teacher websites include important classroom and academic information
2. Parents may also receive Greenland High School announcements, and follow social media avenues such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Remind 101.
3. Login information to parents to Home Access Center (HAC). This gives the parents the ability to check their child's grades and attendance online.
4. Progress reports are sent home after the 5th week of each quarter.
5. Report cards are mailed home to parents after each 9-week grading period

Parental Enrichment: Greenland High School will hold regularly scheduled parent meetings, conferences, and activities throughout the school year. These meetings are held at flexible times, with the goal of increasing parental involvement and School-Parent relationships.

1. All parents and families in the Greenland community have the opportunity to attend meetings throughout the school year. These meetings will provide
