What is Title 1? Title I, Part A (Title I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

GOAL

To provide instructional services and activities to meet the needs of students who are at risk for not achieving proficiency on the state's challenging standards.



In Our District

Title 1 provides us with funding for instructional aides, progress monitoring, parental involvement, training for teachers, interventionists, and supplemental resources for classrooms.

How do we receive Title 1 funds?

1st – The Federal Government provides funding to the state
2nd – The state sends the money to our district
3rd – The district distributes Title 1 funds as necessary per each campus

The entire staff of Jefferson ISD pledges to dedicate themselves to:

- Provide a comprehensive academic curriculum that includes all Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills.
- Provide programs, technology, and methods of instruction that meet the needs of all students.
- Invite all parents to an annual Title 1 meeting so they have an opportunity to make suggestion for the curriculum and programs.
- Provide opportunities for parents to meet with teachers to discuss student progress.
- Provide parent training so parents can learn how to help improve student achievement and become more effective parents.

- Monitor your child's progress through report cards, progress reports, and parent-teacher conferences.
- Attend conferences and parent education nights.
- Communicate with your child's teacher regularly.
