Guest Speaker- Wendy Looney, Jefferson Lions Club President, Texas Lions Camp Elected Director spoke about the Texas Lions Camp and Lions Vision Mission.

The Texas Lions Camp is for children ages 6yrs to 16 yrs. of age with disabilities. The camp is located in Kerrville TX and is fully funded by the Lions Club. There is no cost to the parents or children. This is a weeklong camp with counselors, medical staff, dietitians and other staff that are able to totally meet the needs of a child with disabilities. Open enrollment starts January 2, 2019 and the child will need a current physical to complete the application process. Lions Spot Vision Screening Program is to help all children with vision needs. Ms. Looney showed the Spot vision machine that can do vision screening of our students. Each test is approximately 30 seconds and the machine can read children as small as 6 months of age. This test will tell if the child needs to be seen by a doctor. The test is free and is done by Lions that have a certification to perform the test. Lions Club can provide and pay for eye exams and glasses for the eye doctor.
