Hempstead, Texas is the county seat of Waller County and is located approximately 50 miles northwest of the Houston Downtown Area.

The town is famously known for its watermelon crops. An annual Watermelon Festival is held in July. A Run for the Fallen is also an annual community event in conjunction with the festival. Top attractions include the John Fairey Gardens, Liendo Plantation, and Dilorio Farms, and the Waller County Veterans Memorial.
