Whitharral School and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) (participating children), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

School Responsibilities

Whitharral School will:

- **Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:**
 - *The school strives to have a 100% high-qualified staff to provide high-quality instruction in a safe and caring environment that values diversity and student success.*
- **Hold parent – teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement**
 - *Specifically, those conferences will be held:*
- **Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.**
 - *Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows*
 - *Progress reports will be sent out at the end of the third week of each six weeks grading period. Report cards will be sent out at the end of each six weeks grading period.*
 - *Parents have 24/7 access to Parent Portal where they may view their child's grades, attendance, tardies, etc.*
- **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.**
 - *Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with the parents as follows*
 - *Parents may contact staff by calling the office or emailing the specific staff member*
 - *A meeting may be scheduled before school, after school, or during their conference period*

 - *Parents may volunteer during athletic events, on field trips, during field day and other scheduled events*
 - *Parent visits to the classroom may be scheduled with the classroom teacher*

Parent Responsibilities

As a parent I will support my child's learning in the following ways:

- Monitoring attendance
- Ensuring my child gets the proper amount of sleep each night
- Ensuring that homework is completed
- Monitoring amount of television children watch
- Taking time to listen/talk with my child
- Praising his/her successes/efforts
- Volunteering in my child's classroom
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail, and responding, as appropriate
- Serving, to the extent possible, as a representative for Title I, Part A parent on the District-wide Site-Base Committee, the State's Committee of Practitioners, or other state advisory or policy groups

Student Responsibilities (as appropriate to grade level)
