*** SSHhhhh, we're taking a test!! ***

Beginning May 9th our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will be taking the annual MAP test. MAP stands for Missouri Assessment Program and is a series of assessment testing for English, Language Arts, Math, and Science.

MAP testing adopts standards which help students establish the knowledge and skills to successfully advance through elementary and secondary education, to qualify for graduation and to prepare students for postsecondary education, the workplace or both.

The Show-Me Standards are guides to what students should know and what they should be able to do. The test is scored according to four achievement levels: Below Basic, Basic, Proficient and Advanced.

While teachers and students work all year preparing, families at home can also help get their students test ready. Here are a few tips:

– Read, read, read, and Write, write; one of the simplest steps to improve reading is to set aside periods of time for your child to read. It is proven that reading improves writing, and writing improves reading.

– Be aware of the test schedule!: know what days your student(s) are testing and try to make sure they are in attendance and on time. Students who arrive late (or students who have to leave early) after testing has began will have to wait in the office until there is a break between sessions so they do not disrupt the class.

 Be encouraging and supportive: cheer on your kiddos with positive thoughts and reassurance so they will do their best. Make sure they get a good nights sleep and make sure they get a good breakfast (either at home or here at school when they arrive).

The entire building joins in to support and encourage all of our students that are testing. We have lower level classes that are "adopting" upper level grades to help boost

them up before testing begins and we are asking if any 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade parents would like to donate snacks for our testing students. If you can help we're asking for individually wrapped snacks or we have an Amazon wishlist for items as well. There are 300 students in 3rd through 5th grade. Some snack ideas are: fruit snack, juice boxes, Cheez-Its, cookies, cheese crackers, pretzels, chips, apples, oranges, etc... We need all treats and drinks brought in by May 6th.

Summer school is open to all students beginning with our fall incoming kindergarten students. Current 5th grade students, who will be 6th graders in the fall, will attend summer school at OMS.

Forms are due by April 25th so we can staff and plan bus routes

Summer classes will review the areas of math, reading, and science. It will also focus on helping fill the gap created in curriculum and social skills created during covid shutdown. Summer session enhances and extends learning requirements while in a smaller, more relaxed environment - while also having some fun in the sun!

For our new, incoming, fall kindergarten students, summer school is the absolute perfect way for them to get familiar with the building when it's not completely full of students and staff. It helps them get their "first time in the big school" jitters so when fall comes around, they will be more comfortable, relaxed, and ready to go to "the big school." It also helps them begin to learn school expectations and helps them increase their social skills.

Breakfast, lunch, and transportation will be provided, however, transportation will run on a reduced route schedule. Once routes are established for summer, if a late sign up isn't on the route, they will have to meet at a route stop or be parent drop off or pick up.
