Enrollment is OPEN

It's already time to sign up our new little Dutchmen and Dutchgirls that will be starting Preschool and Kindergarten for the fall 2019-2020 school year.

Enrollment and screening take place in the late winter/early spring so we can get an idea of how many students will be starting school to plan for teachers and class sizes over summer.

Preschool screening will be on Thursday, Feb. 28th.

Preschoolers <u>MUST</u> be 4 <u>BEFORE</u> August 1, 2019 to be eligible.

This does not guarantee placement. For preschool, placement is based on test scores with preference given to those who do not score as high, but is open to all if there is availability.

There are 15 openings for preschool students in the morning and 15 in the afternoon. Morning session is from 8:30 am-11:00 am and afternoon is from 12:45 pm-3:15 pm. Preschool is five days a week and free of charge.

Transportation is only provided in the morning for morning PreK students who can ride the bus to school, if they have a sibling who rides or if it is an established bus stop, but must be picked up after class at 11am.

Afternoon students must be brought to school at 12:45pm and can ride the bus home at the end of the day, again, if with a sibling or to an established bus stop.

Kindergarten screening will be Friday, March 1st.

Kindergarteners <u>MUST</u> be 5 <u>BEFORE</u> August. 1, 2019.

Kindergarten is a full day of school.

The screening is free and consists of vision and hearing screenings along with a test of readiness skills, therefore, it is necessary for your child to accompany you for enrollment.

Please allow at least 90 minutes for this appointment. At both PreK and Kindergarten appointments you must bring in the following information, as well as, fill out an enrollment form:

- -state issued birth certificate
- —social security number
- —immunization record

—proof of residency (utility bill, such as electric or water, with your name and address on it or a rental or lease agreement)

(If you are missing any of this information at the appointment time, you still must bring your child in for the actual screening test and can bring in the paperwork later)

Cyber Safety. Did You Know?

Info from the Pulaski County Sheriff's office: Kids get a new phone for Christmas? Do you know about the apps they can use to message and send pictures to other people? Do you know about the app they can use to hide pictures from you? Have you told them how predators may pose as other kids?

With the world revolving around social media, please educate yourself, and watch for signs from your children. Some of the apps featured are:

Calculator% — this app looks like a calculator but functions like a secret photo vault

 $\label{eq:Snapchat} \begin{tabular}{ll} Snapchat $--$ this is the way most tweens/\\ teens chat with each other. Messages and \\ \end{tabular}$

Snaps disappear within seconds and stories go away in 24 hours. Kids live for "streaks" of communication

Instagram — many kids are creating fake accounts to hide content from parents. Kids also prefer to text using this app because most parents don't know to check the messages

Whisper — anonymous app that promotes sharing secrets and meeting new people

Wishbone—app allows users to compare anything, such as comparing kids against each other and rating them on a scale

Ask.fm—ask an anonymous question and

get an answer. This app has been linked to the most severe forms of cyberbullying.

Kik—messaging app with built in apps and web content that would normally be filtered on a home computer

The Game by Hot or Not— strangers rate your picture

Omegle—chat website that promotes chatting with anonymous strangers
