Attendance MA+ters

Regular and punctual attendance is expected of each student enrolled in the district. This is necessary in order to get maximum benefit from the instructional program and to develop habits of punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility. There is a direct relationship between poor attendance, class failure, and high school dropouts. Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades, enjoy school more, and are much more employable after high school graduation.

An absence will be recorded as unexcused if the parent has not contacted the school on the day of the absence. You can call before 7:30am and leave a message on the attendance line or call the office before 10am. If we have not received a call by 10am, the office will make calls to verify the absence. If we are unable to reach anyone, the absence will stay marked as unexcused until we hear back from someone or until we receive a doctor/ dentist or similar type of excuse.

When we receive a call the absence is marked as verified. When we receive a doctors/dentist/therapy, etc... note, then the absence is marked as excused. Both (V) verified and (X) excused are considered excused absences, however, excessive absences whether unexcused or excused are subject to a school official reaching out to the parent to discuss the reason of the chronic absenteeism.

An attendance report is ran once a week and letters/emails are automatically generated after 3, 5, 8, and 12 absences regardless of excused or unexcused. These letters are just to keep parents up to date on the status of their child's attendance.

Attendance becomes a concern when a student has accumulated more than 12 unexcused absences in a semester. The district will then determine whether there is reason to suspect educational neglect or whether the parent is violating the compulsory attendance law. If so, the district may contact Children's division or the local prosecutor.

These attendance guidelines are the same across all GCR-II schools. Following these standards should become a habit throughout the child's academic years for both parents and students, so it's best to start early.

We understand there are instances and circumstances where a student cannot be in attendance at school and if they are running a fever or throwing up, they shouldn't be here anyway, but please just remember to call the school to record the absence and if you visit a doctor to be sure to get an excuse letter or have them fax it to us at 573.437.5405.

Every day counts — literally. Attendance matters, so please keep the school informed.
