To determine eligibility for participation, the Talent Search identifies academically talented 7th graders based on standardized test scores. Candidates may choose to complete either the SAT Reasoning Test or the ACT Assessment college entrance examination. Students who score at certain levels on the ACT or SAT are invited to attend a State Recognition Ceremony. In addition to the State Recognition Ceremony, students with the highest scores are honored at the Grand Recognition Ceremony at Duke University.

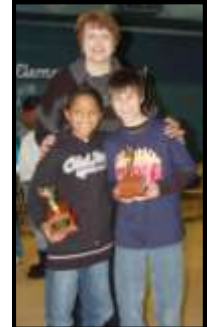

Givens Elementary

All Prekindergarten students were assessed using the CIRCLE assessment. All Prekindergarten regular-education classrooms were Texas School-Ready certified.
Prekindergarten students participated bimonthly in Guidance classes. Classes were conducted by the T. G. Givens Director.
Prekindergarten students went to the library twice weekly. Services were provided by a certified librarian.
Prekindergarten students attended P. E. two times per week.
There was one full-day Bilingual Prekindergarten class and one half day Bilingual Prekindergarten class.
Two Speech Therapists and one Social Skills/ISS Teacher Assistant provided individual and small-group instruction for Prekindergarten students.
Prekindergarten students attended a computer lab each week. A nurse assistant was available each day to assist students with health issues, including vision and hearing screening.
Breakfast and lunch were served daily, in accordance with federal nutritional guidelines.
All pre-kindergarten students participated in one major musical, with full costuming, each year.
Special events honored parents, grandparents, and special friends, including Prekindergarten Thanksgiving sharing feast, Pre-K rodeo and luncheon, and Prekindergarten moving-up ceremony.
Local organizations, including Kiwanis Club of Paris, Lamar County Retired Teachers Association, and the Paris High School Spanish Students read to Givens Prekindergarten students. In addition, "Mr. Jones", a community volunteer, read to Prekindergarten students weekly.
Curriculum-based field trips and the Fall Festival were fully funded by the Givens PTO.



Head Start

Served 227 children and families from the five school districts located in Lamar County during the 2010-2011 School Year.

Parents and community members logged 9,205 volunteer hours with 490 persons volunteering during the school year.

Dr. Keith Green and staff provided free dental screenings for 227 children.

Through partnerships with Texas A&M University and Primary Healthcare Associates, 100% of enrolled children received a complete full health and mental health, and developmental screenings. Follow up assistance was provided as needed for all students.

The Head Start Program participated in community partnership coordinated services agreements with fifty local agencies, schools, churches and businesses.

Provided our annual October "Big Wheels on Campus" Expo which brought in dozens of vehicles (and owners) from our community to show the students their big rigs, motor cycles, fire trucks, emergency vehicles and city street repair equipment to name only a few.

Community persons, businesses, local churches, national resources and civic organizations donated approximately \$19,026 in funds, goods and services to assist Head Start Families.

Provided "Read With Me" Family Literacy program for all Head Start parents/guardians throughout the year. Sessions were held every Tuesday, September through May.

Fire Station One Firefighters helped with the literacy effort by participating in a "Stop Drop & Read" reading time in the classrooms.

Retired Teachers Association continued to bring the "Books for Children" program to the Head Start campus.

Campus Teachers continued to participate in training to achieve an additional Texas Education Agency Certification as "Texas School Ready !" Pre Kindergarten Teachers through a partnership with the Region 8 Service Center.

Campus wide, our staff participated in 179 training classes in the areas of early childhood education, health services, social services, technology and administration.

Provided 95 hands on workshops, meetings and family activities for Head Start families.

Seven Parent Policy Council members and one staff member represented the program at the National Head Start Parent Conference in Virginia Beach, Virginia in December 2010.

A continued partnership with TCIM yielded new books for each student to take home, winter clothing for students and a series of on campus reading sessions with students.
