The society is sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese. Formally organized as the Spanish National Honor Society in 1953, the name was changed in 1959. At present there are over 1,700 national and international chapters.

To be eligible, students must have an average of 85 in the third year study of Pre-AP or AP Spanish and be in the 10th grade or higher. The student must complete a minimum of three years of advanced Spanish and remain an active member in good standing.
