Paris High School students conducted successful clothing drive

The Paris High School National Honor Society announces the Back-to-School clothing Drive exceeded all goals all expectations. With the support of Maurices in Mirabeau Square offering 20% off for clothing donations, NHS was able to collect over 3,500 clothing items for all ages.

According to drive chairman, Trey Kraft, the goal of 1,000 items was met within the first 7 days and at one point The Salvation Army was forced to turn away donations for lack of space. Donations were temporarily redirected to Christians in Action at that time.
