

FAQs

1. What ages are allowed to enroll?
Students entering 2nd-12th grades can participate.
2. Can my student participate in the MVLA and participate in athletics?
Students in 7th-12th grades can participate in any of our extra-curricular activities including band, FFA, choir, athletics, etc.
3. Can homeschool students participate in MVLA?
Students who live in the Morris School District are eligible to participate if they meet the requirements. Homeschool students will need to take an assessment administered by MPS and score in the 80th percentile.
4. Can EPIC students participate in MVLA?
Students who live in the Morris School District and are enrolled in EPIC are eligible to participate if they have a 3.0 GPA, or a minimum 3.5 GPA in the prior semester.
5. Can students in other districts participate in MVLA?
Any student enrolled in MPS last school year is eligible to participate in the program including transferred students. Students who are not currently transferred into the MPS system must complete one year of traditional enrollment and meet requirements to be eligible for the MVLA.
6. Can a student have a blended schedule?
Student must be enrolled in six (6) periods. High School students can have any mix of those courses. For example, a student may be enrolled in 4 MVLA classes, agriculture education, and athletics. Students in the 7th and 8th grades will enroll in four core subjects for MVLA, and two electives which could be MVLA or electives from the MVLA course offerings. Students from 2nd-6th grades will be enrolled in a complete MVLA schedule.
7. Isn't this an alternative school?
No. We still have an alternative school option for students through a partnership with Henryetta Public Schools.
8. Does the school district provide home internet or devices?
MVLA will provide students with a Chromebook that can be used with WIFI. We will not provide home internet services. Courses will be accessible on any device that is connected to the internet.
9. Will students be allowed to work ahead with the goal to graduate early?
It is not the purpose of the MVLA to promote early graduation. Students will be allowed to enroll in one full schedule per semester.
