Teachers will have discussions about students in multiple classes as well as non-academic contributing factors to student success. Students will be moved fluidly in and out of Rtl based on current needs as demonstrated by current student data. Students will be monitored on academic and behavioral standards. Teachers, parents and students will have constant feedback about student success.
