Bearden Elementary School is dedicated to prepare our students with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the challenges from childhood to adolescence.

The following outline is in compliance with the legal requirements of Arkansas Act 603 of 2003 (6-15-1602), the Parent Involvement Plan and the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (PL 107-110). This document represents a joint effort of parents, students and school staff.

- I. Parenting-Bearden Elementary School will continue to assist families with parenting, child-rearing skills, and character education.
 - A. A wide variety of materials will be accessible to parents on topics dealing with parenting skills in the BES Parent Involvement Center. Current booklets available are: Helping Your Child Become a Reader, Helping Your Child Succeed in School, and Helping Your Child Become a Responsible Citizen.
 - B. A survey will be presented to the parents at the parent/teacher conference and time allowed for response. The survey will include suggestions and concerns that parents may have concerning all areas of Bearden Elementary and the Parental Involvement Center.
 - C. BES will hold several Parent Involvement activities. Outdoor Family Movie Night after Open-House; Grandparents' Day lunch; Thanksgiving Meal with parents and family; Parent invitations to eat lunch with their Star Student; A Fall Harvest Carnival; Daddy/Daughter – Mother/Son dance; other student body activities held throughout the year that parents are always welcome to attend such as Valentine's Day dances, Christmas parties, Student Council movie nights, etc.
- II. Communicating-Communication between home and school is regular, two-way, and meaningful.
 - A. Bearden Elementary School has developed packets of information appropriate for the age and grade of the student containing the following information:
 - a. Information on Arkansas State Frameworks and Local Curriculum Plans
 - b. Health and Wellness Information
 - c. School Calendar
 - d. Testing Calendar
 - e. School and Teacher contact information
 - f. Teacher and bell schedules
 - g. No Bullying Information
 - A. Communication folders/planners will be sent to parents daily that could include: personal letters, weekly grade reports, calendar, etc. BES Teachers will work diligently on making sure information is sent home through these folders and planners to keep communication current.
 - B. Bearden Elementary School has scheduled two parent-teacher conferences per school year.
 - C. Teachers will each keep a folder recording parent communication in their classroom.
 - D. Bearden Elementary School will participate in district "Parental Involvement/Parent Nights". The parents are given a report on the school and an overview of assessments, learning environments and expectations.
 - F. Parents will be given the opportunity to have his/her child's Benchmark and/or Iowa test results interpreted for them in a group and/or individually with the school counselor upon request.

- III. Volunteering-BES parents are very active in various roles of volunteering in the school.
- B. BES sends out a volunteer survey to determine in what areas volunteers are interested in working with the school. These volunteers are called upon to help with the activities held as mentioned in number I above.
 - C. BES has also provided all volunteers and substitute training on our handbook information, especially our discipline policies so they can be better prepared to play a vital role in our educational process.
 - D. A substitute handbook is provided that assists them with daily routines of classroom activities, including schedules. There is a substitute folder in all classrooms for substitutes to follow.
- IV. Learn at Home - Involves families with their children in learning activities at home, including homework and other curriculum-linked activities and decisions.
- A. Grade level packets are given to parents with objectives where they may focus with their child.
 - B. Each grade level informs parents of homework routines and policies.
 - C. The principal sends home a monthly calendar of events written in English and in Spanish.
 - D. BES Teachers send home a newsletter with each new unit in Go-Math.
 - E. Pamphlets are available in the entrance of BES for assistance to parents in many areas of academics and student behavior.
- V. School Decision Making and Advocacy-Parents are full partners in the decisions that affect children and families.

A Parent Involvement Committee is established consisting of: parents, other school employees, and teachers. The committee meets regularly and discusses ideas on how to get involvement and ways to get school information to parents. The committee meetings are announced to the public so that any parent may come and pose school related questions if needed.

The Bearden School Board is very involved in decisions posed by the Bearden Elementary School.

- VI. Collaborating with Community-Community resources are used to strengthen schools, families and student learning.
- A. There is a local food/clothes drive held in collaboration with the school that is for the entire community. It is announced in the school, as well as the community.
 - B. Bearden Elementary students are awarded quarterly for good behavior, Accelerated Reader goals being met, and achievement whether it be honor roll or making excellent progress. A student from each class is honored and recognized each week as student of the week with a certificate, their picture taken and shown through the use of a power point on a monitor placed in the hallway at our entrance.
 - C. Bearden Elementary will foster and support student participation in community service and fundraisers.
