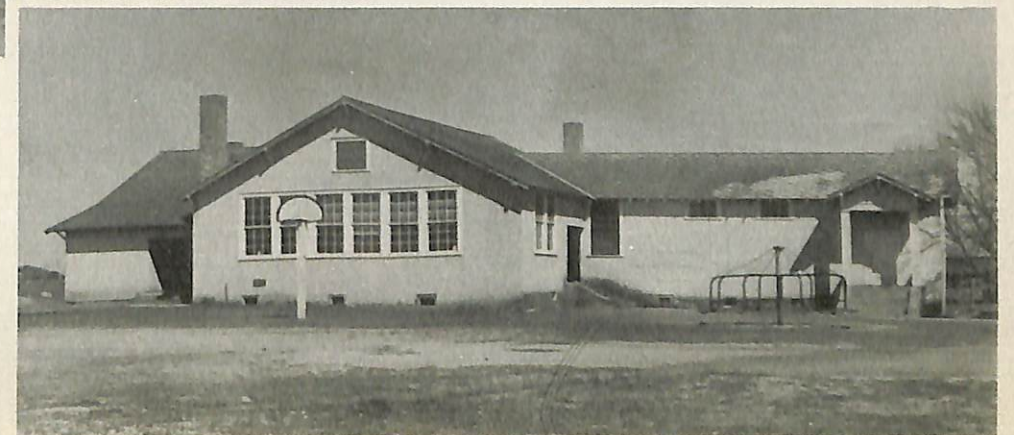

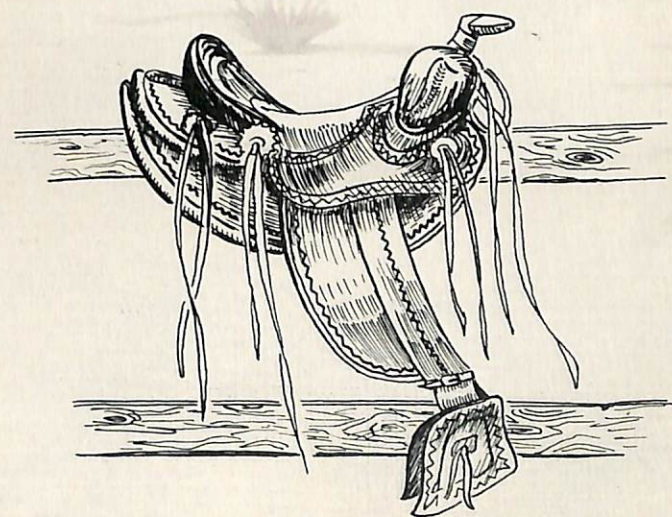

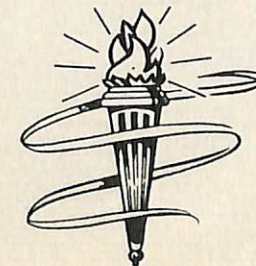


## Superintendent's Message

## F.F.A. ACTIVITIES

THEREFORE, BOTH TEAMS QUALIFIED FOR THE AREA MEET. THE JUNIOR QUIZ TEAM WON FIRST PLACE IN THE AREA MEET, WHICH QUALIFIED THE TEAM FOR THE STATE MEET, BUT IN THIS MEET THE TEAM FAILED TO PLACE. 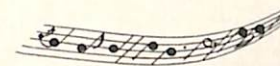

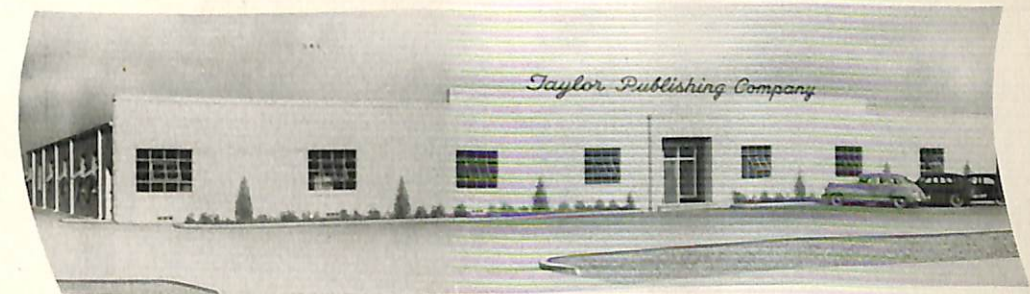

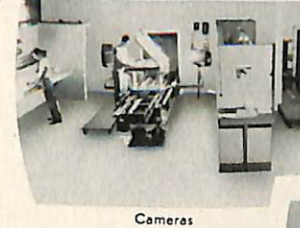
