SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

YEAR ONE

- Applicants or their parents must be current members of Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation.
- Applicants must have earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher for 4 years of high school
- Applicants must graduate from high school in the spring of 2020
- Applicants must attend an accredited Louisiana college or university during the fall and spring immediately following their high school graduation.
 The scholarship may not be deferred.
- Applicants must pursue a curriculum in agriculture, vocational agriculture, agribusiness, agriscience, or other curriculum directly benefiting the agricultural sector of Louisiana's economy.
- Scholarship winners must earn a minimum grade point average of 2.5 during the first semester and maintain a major course of study in agriculture for the second semester in order to qualify for the second payment.

YEARS TWO, THREE AND FOUR

- Scholarship winners may reapply to continue receiving their award for the spring and fall terms of each successive year for three additional years. The amount of the scholarship award may vary each successive year.
- Applicants and/or their parents must maintain membership in Louisiana Farm Bureau.
- Applicants must have earn at least a 2.5 GPA for the spring term in order to re-apply for the next fall.
- Applicants must maintain a major field of study in agriculture at an accredited Louisiana university in order to qualify for an extension of their scholarship.
- If an applicant fails to maintain eligibility in any spring term, that applicant may not apply for the succeeding fall term.



Linda and Wayne Zaunbrecher are lifetime residents of Vermilion Parish and rice and cattle farmers. Prior to his death, Wayne was a board member of the Vermilion Parish Farm Bureau and Treasurer of the Louisiana Rice Promotion Board.

Linda has served as 3rd Vice President of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, a member of its board of directors, Chair of the State Women's Leadership Committee, and a member of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Foundation's scholarship committee since its inception in the early 1990s. Both have been avid supporters of agricultural education.

To honor their many years of volunteerism and loyal service to Louisiana Farm Bureau, our scholarship is known as "The Linda and Wayne Zaunbrecher Scholarship."

A four-year scholarship helping to fund the future of Louisiana Agriculture

Louisiana Farm Bureau is a voluntary organization of farm and ranch families that works to achieve legislative and economic benefits for its members. Through its strength as the state's largest general farm organization, Louisiana Farm Bureau is the "Voice of Louisiana Agriculture" for all matters important to farm and ranch families, agribusiness, and others who share our philosophy.

We are vitally interested in having the business of agriculture run by future generations of farm and ranch families. To help achieve this goal, we formed a tax-exempt foundation to award scholarships to deserving students pursuing careers in agriculture. We awarded the first two scholarships in 1993, and since then we have awarded 166 scholarships— for a total of over \$380,000 to assist graduating high school seniors in their college careers.

In May of 2020, we will award five \$2,000 scholarships to applicants submitted by the parish Farm Bureaus. These winners will be chosen based on grade point average, ACT scores, individual achievement in high school, participation in parish and state Farm Bureau activities, and financial need. The 2020 winners are eligible to receive \$2,000 during their freshman year in payments of \$1,000 for each semester of the 2019-20 academic year. If this year's winners remain qualified, they may reapply each succeeding year to continue their scholarships for a total of four years. The amount of money paid to each winner may vary from year to year.

We invite the graduating seniors of 2020 to review the eligibility requirements. If you plan to pursue a career in agriculture and meet the other requirements, obtain an application from your local parish Farm Bureau, complete it, and return it to that office by the deadline. Each parish Farm Bureau is eligible to submit one application for consideration as a state winner.
