Toilet Paper Roll Bird Feeder

Requires Adult help

1. Cut the paper towel roll in half
2. Run a long piece of string through an empty toilet paper roll and tie together at the ends.
3. Have your child smear peanut butter, soy butter, lard, or leftover cooking fat all over the surface of the roll.
4. Roll it through birdseed and hang your toilet paper roll bird feeder for all to see.

Milk Carton Bird Feeder

Requires Adult help

Use this project to create a temporary bird feeder that the kids can decorate however they like.

1. Clean and dry an empty milk carton.
2. Cut a hole big enough for a bird to fit.
3. Punch a hole in the top of the feeder and thread a string through. Tie at the top and secure.
4. Let your child decorate as she wishes. Construction paper is fine, but it will likely get ruined in inclement weather. Instead, try acrylic paint or crayons.
5. Once the bird feeder is dry, fill with birdseed and hang.

Orange Half Bird Feeder

Requires Adult help

Another fun project, this is a good use for those oranges that have been around a little too long. You will be using the orange peel to create a hanging boat for the birdseed.

1. Cut an orange in half and clean out all the fruit and pulp. Take care not to rip or tear the rind.
2. Poke two tiny holes across the diameter of the orange, directly opposite from each other.
3. Thread a string through and secure at the top.
4. Fill the orange with a mixture of peanut butter and birdseed (or lard or leftover cooking fat) and hang.

Cereal Bird Feeder

This makes great use of any stale round cereal you might have in the house.

1. Take a long length of string and tie a knot at the end that is big enough so the cereal can't drop through.
2. Ask your child to put circle-shaped cereal, such as Cheerios, onto the string.
3. Once the string is full, tie the ends together and secure it to a tree or porch.

Toilet Paper Roll Binoculars

Supplies:

- 2 toilet paper rolls
- construction paper
- masking tape
- yarn
- scissors
- hole punch (optional)

Directions:

1. Start with a paper towel roll and tape them together with masking tape.



2. You can either decorate them now and leave them like this or cut the construction paper to the length of the toilet paper rolls. Color the construction paper to “design” your binoculars.



3. Punch a hole on the outside of both toilet paper rolls and add your string, tying it through the holes. Enjoy!!!
