FUN FACTS ABOUT SHARKS FOR KIDS

1. Sharks have several rows of teeth and might have as many as 3,000 teeth in their mouth~~s~~ at one time.
2. It is hard to see in the murky waters of the deep, but sharks have excellent vision. Their night vision is better than a cat's or a wolf's.
3. A shark's sense of smell is 10,000 times better than a human~~s~~. (or "than a human's is")
4. Sharks can detect electrical impulses, including another animal's beating heart.
5. Sharks are picky eaters. They often take one bite of something before they decide to eat it.

Cut out and Put the Dolphins in order by size from small to largest.

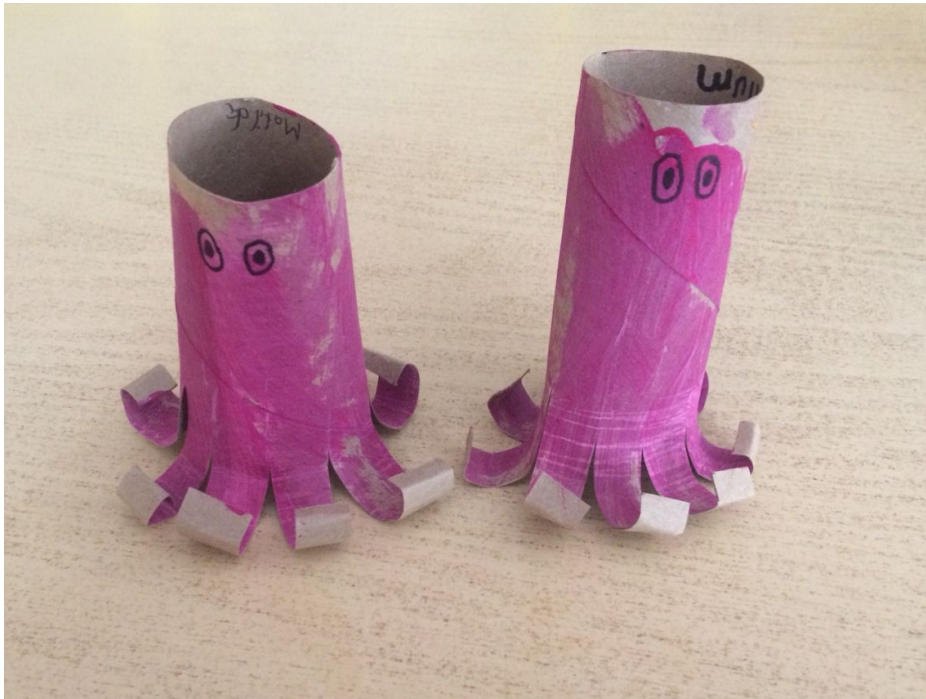






Paper Towel Roll Octopus

1. Cut your paper towel roll in half.
2. Paint or color the roll the color you want
3. Allow to dry if you are using paint.
4. Carefully cut 8 strips at one end, this will be the legs
5. Draw eyes and a mouth



How to play Simon Says

Simon Says is the classic game that can be used anywhere from a day at the beach, to a long car ride or even a simple ice breaker. Listen closely as “Simon” gives you directions. If “Simon” says to do something, you better act fast. But, if “Simon” does not and you do it anyway, you are out!

Requires

At least 3 people, but more people make for more fun

Game play

One person is designated Simon, the others are the players. Standing in front of the group, Simon tells players what they must do. However, the players must only obey commands that begin with the words “Simon Says.”

If Simon says, “Simon says touch your nose,” then players must touch their nose. But, if Simon simply says, “jump,” *without* first saying “Simon says,” players must not jump. Those that do jump are out.

Objective

Follow directions and stay in the game for as long as possible! The last player standing wins and becomes the next Simon. If you’re Simon, the object is to try to dupe the players to follow your commands when they shouldn’t.
