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- 1 **Priority 1:** Students at Bergman Elementary will demonstrate improvement in literacy skills.
- 1.1 **Goal:** It is the goal that students at Bergman Elementary should see an improvement in practical reading and writing, as well as content and style in writing.

Benchmark: Bergman Elementary conducted a three-year trend analysis of students Literacy achievement using the Augmented Benchmark Exam, the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) and formative assessments. Practical Reading and Writing multiple choice questions have been our lowest scores over the last four years as well as Practical Reading and Writing Content and Style open response questions. Appropriate use of Capitalization, particularly in writing conventions, and when to use Apostrophes are also areas of concern. In addition to the previous items, our students with disabilities also continue to have difficulty with finding the Main Idea, Inferences and Interpreting information without writings.

- 2 **Priority 2:** Bergman Elementary has made it a priority to improve math skills for elementary students.
- 2.1 Goal: It is the goal of Bergman Elementary that students will demonstrate improvement in measurement, data analysis, and probability.

Benchmark: Bergman Elementary conducted a three-year trend analysis of students Math achievement using the Augmented Benchmark Exam, the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) and formative assessments. Results for both combined and each subpopulation were examined to identify weaknesses. Measurement continues to be the weakest area in both multiple choice and open response items, with the exception of 2013 3rd grade open response. Measurement was their strongest area, with the weakest that year being Numbers and Operations. Various types of estimation and multi-step problems have continually been a difficult area, particularly for students with disabilities.
