

Lesson 16: Class Pairs

Analogies can help you compare word pairs in different classes.



Key to Solving

How are the words in the first pair alike? How are the words in the second pair alike? How is the second pair similar to the first pair?

Snowboarding is to snow sport as sailing is to water sport.

Snowboarding is an example of a snow sport. Sailing is an example of a water sport. Each word pair describes a member and its class. In this way, the relationship between snowboarding and snow sport is like the relationship between sailing and water sport.
