

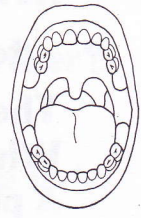
# Lesson 20: Comparing Objects and Functions .....

Analogies can help you compare word pairs of different objects and functions.



## Key to Solving

- How are the words in the first pair related?
- How are the words in the second pair related?
- How is the second pair similar to the first pair?



Tongue is to taste as ears are to hear.

The function of a tongue is to taste. The function of ears is to hear. In this way, the relationship between tongue and taste is like the relationship between ears and hear.

tongue : taste :: ears : hear
