

# Lesson 31: Location Pairs .....

Analogies can be used to compare the locations of different things.

## Key to Solving

How are these words related?

cage, zoo    stall, stable

A cage might be found in a zoo. Where might a stall be found? A stall might be found in a stable.

We can make an analogy to compare the two word pairs: Cage is to zoo as stall is to stable.
