

# Lesson 32: Location Analogies .....

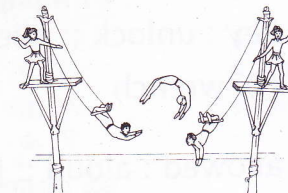
Analogies can be used to compare one person, animal, or object and location to another.

How can you compare one person and location to another?

spelunker, cave      acrobat, circus
