# Dalhart Junior High School Dalhart Junior High School Cell Phone Policy 2022-2023

For safety purposes, the district permits students to possess personal mobile telephones; however, <u>these devices must remain turned off and placed in a backpack during the</u> <u>instructional day</u>, including during all testing. Each student has access to a phone in the office to call home.

The use of mobile telephones or any device capable of capturing images is strictly prohibited in locker rooms or restroom areas while at school or at a school-related or school-sponsored event.

If a student uses a telecommunications device without authorization during the school day, the device will be confiscated. This includes phones, **smart watches**, tablets, etc. The parent may pick up the confiscated telecommunications device from the principal's office for a **fee of**\$15 each time the device is confiscated.

In limited circumstances and in accordance with law, a student's personal telecommunications device may be searched by authorized personnel. [See **Searches** and policy FNF.]

Any disciplinary action will be in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. The district is not responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen telecommunications devices.

No warnings will be given to students. This policy serves as a warning.
