Attendance is so very important for student progress. Texas Education Code (TEC), Sec. 25.092(a) states: a student in any grade level from kindergarten through grade 12 may not be given credit or a final grade for a class unless the student is in attendance for at least 90% of the days the class is offered.

In addition, according to TEC, Sec. 25.095, if a student is absent from school on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year: (1) the student's parent is subject to prosecution under TEC Section 25.093; and (2) the student is subject to referral to a truancy court for truant conduct under Section 65.003(a), Family Code.

Attendance plays a major role in the student progress and reading on grade level. At the campus level, many of the state awards for excellence require a 96% attendance rate.

We need your help. Please try to make all medical, dental, or other appointments after school hours if possible. Please impress upon your child(ren) the importance of attendance. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

I understand that Parent contributing to truancy charges may be filed against me if my child misses more than 10 days in a six- month period of the same school year.

Cell Phone Policy

For safety purposes, the district permits students to possess personal mobile telephones; however, **these devices must remain turned off and placed in a backpack during the instructional day**, including during all testing. Each student has access to a phone in the office to call home.

The use of mobile telephones or any device capable of capturing images is strictly prohibited in locker rooms or restroom areas while at school or at a school-related or school-sponsored event.

If a student uses a telecommunications device without authorization during the school day, the device will be confiscated. This includes phones, **smart watches**, tablets, etc. The parent may pick up the confiscated telecommunications device from the principal's office for a **fee of \$15 each time** the device is confiscated.

In limited circumstances and in accordance with law, a student's personal telecommunications device may be searched by authorized personnel. [See **Searches** and policy FNF.]

Any disciplinary action will be in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. The district is not responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen telecommunications devices.

No warnings will be given to students. This policy serves as a warning.

In accordance with DALHART ISD POLICY FO (LEGAL/LOCAL), corporal punishment may be used as a student discipline technique. As a matter of administrative practice, the principal or designee will attempt to contact the parent/guardian of each student before corporal punishment may be administered to that student. A valid, reasonable attempt to contact the parent shall be considered accomplished when the principal or designee contacts (or tries to contact) the parent/guardian by telephone using the most recent primary telephone number listed in the school office. The principal or designee shall maintain a record of his/her parent/guardian contact or attempt to contact the parent/guardian. Each time corporal punishment is administered to a student, the principal/designee shall mail a copy of the discipline form to the parent/guardian within two school days.

A student may refuse to accept corporal punishment as a discipline management technique and instead accept other such discipline management techniques as the principal or designee may assign.
