

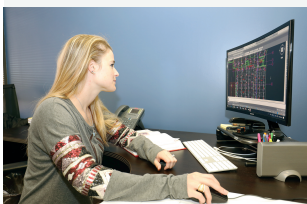


BECOME A LIFE-SAVER

Draft and plan the layout of fire protection systems with accuracy to enable field installation with few design errors.



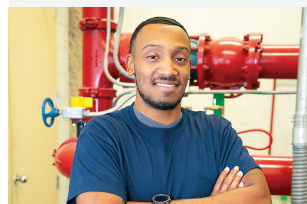
INSTALLER
