Charles Trammell Memorial Scholarship \$1000 Award

Mr. Charles Trammell was one of the most beloved educational leaders in the history of Valley Springs School. He was a valedictorian and graduate of the class of 1973 of Valley Springs High School and later served as a teacher, principal, superintendent, encourager, coach, and mentor to thousands of students and teachers during his 27-year educational tenure in the Valley Springs School District. "Mr. T." went above and beyond his regular duties by doing things such as greeting the car riders each morning before school, mowing the schoolyards, and clearing off the parking lots after snowstorms. He truly loved walking around school meeting and greeting teachers and students. At his retirement dinner in 2014, guests said Mr. Trammell will always be remembered for his lifelong dedication to the school, work ethic, commitment to academics, and kind and caring heart.

Mr. Trammell was an equally dedicated and faithful member of the First Baptist Church of Valley Springs, serving in various programs and leadership positions. His third great love was his family, and he loved, supported, and encouraged them on a daily basis. When Mr. Trammell passed away in September 2016 after a brief and intense battle with cancer, people remembered him with an outpouring of tributes like the following: "He always acted with integrity." "He set the example for all to follow." "He showed us what it is like to love and care like Jesus." The Valley Springs Foundation has established the Charles Trammell Memorial Scholarship, a one-time \$1000 award, to be given to a graduating Valley Springs High School student who exhibits the same values and passions that exemplify the legacy Mr. Trammell left in the Valley Springs community.
