Tuners Repair percussion, stringed, reed, or wind instruments.

Music Composers and Arrangers Write

and transcribe musical scores.

Music Therapists Plan, organize, or direct medically prescribed music therapy activities designed to positively influence patients' psychological or behavioral status.

Precision Instrument and Equipment

Repairers Some precision instruments are used to measure distance, pressure, altitude, temperature, underwater depth, and other physical properties. Other types of precision equipment include photographic and imaging equipment such as cameras, projectors, and film processing equipment. Precision instrument and equipment repairers

maintain and adjust these delicate items. **Musicians** Music is an important part of military life. Service bands and vocal groups have a strong

tradition of performing at ceremonies, parades, concerts, festivals, and dances. Musicians and singers

perform in service bands, orchestras, and small groups.
