

#### Who can attend?

Enrollment is open to both adults and high school students.

## What will this program cover?

This curriculum includes police function and fundamentals, tactical and interpersonal communications, traffic management and accident investigation, criminal law and procedure, law enforcement equipment, defense tactics, applied concepts in fitness for law enforcement, core healthcare provider CPR and First Aid, interview/interrogation for report writing. American court systems fundamentals, CLEET unarmed security guard, a criminal investigation, 911 telecommunicator fundamentals, victimology, and practical training use of force (MILO).

## How long will it take me to complete the program?

On average, students complete the program in two years if attending only one session (morning or afternoon).

## What certifications will I receive once I complete the program?

You will be able to test for the following certifications: CLEET Unarmed Security Guard Phase I & II CPR/AED/First Aid

NIMS: 100, 200, 700, and 800 911 Telecommunicator
