


HEALTH CAREERS CERTIFICATION

Who can attend?

Enrollment is open to both adult and high school students.

What will this program cover?

This program teaches students to perform routine healthcare and diagnostic procedures under the direction of a nurse, physician, or allied health professionals in various medical settings. Students also learn how to build a solid foundation for future healthcare professions, deliver care to clients in diverse medical settings, explore a variety of healthcare careers, and incorporate ethical principles, confidentiality, and professionalism in all settings.

How long will it take me to complete the program?

On average, students complete the program in one year if attending all-day and in two years if attending only one session (morning or afternoon).

What certifications will I receive once I complete the program?

You will be able to test for the following certifications:

- Long-Term Care Nurse Aide
- CPR
- Phlebotomy
- Medical Assistant

How much does it cost to attend?

Adults

In-district: \$2.00/hour Out-of-district: \$4.00/hour Out-of-state: \$6.00/hour

High School Students Free

The average length of our programs is 1050 hours for adults. At \$2.00/hour, the average total for tuition is \$2,100.00. The cost of additional supplies will vary.

What is the class schedule?

Morning Session: 8:15 AM - 11:00 AM Afternoon Session: 12:00 PM - 3:00 PM

All Day: 8:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. with a 45-minute lunch.

When can I start?

Adults

Start times depend on seat availability, but we start new applicants at two entry points: August and January.

High School Students August or January

How do I apply?

Adults

- Pick up an application and schedule appointments. Appointments will need to be made to complete a WorkKeys Assessment test and attend an admissions interview.
- 2 Complete the FAFSA at https://fafsa.ed.gov/ using the School Code: 09204.
- **3** Attend admissions interview. Make sure to bring all supporting documentation including test scores, financial aid award letters, and application.

High School Students

- 1 Pick up an application from the high school counselor or from our campus.
- **2** Turn application in to a counselor.
- High school counselor will turn in application to us with supporting documentation. This includes: High school transcript, test scores, and attendance record.
