### Parent/Guardian Affidavit

As the parent/guardian of the above named child(ren), I declare my intent to provide home school instruction. I understand and agree that I am solely responsible for the:

- ✓ Selection of instructional materials and textbooks.
- ✓ Setting the time, place and method of instruction.
- ✓ Testing or otherwise evaluating the home school instruction my child receives.

I also understand that any credit earned must be consistent with Morgan School District Policies and that my child(ren) may not qualify for a Morgan High School Diploma. It is the policy of the Morgan School District to accept credit towards graduation from accredited sources.

If my child has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), I understand that my decision to home school does not in any way imply that the district did not provide a free and appropriate public education and I understand and agree that my child has no individual right to receive some or all of the special education and related services he/she would receive if enrolled in a public school in the Morgan School District, unless I have arranged for dual enrollment consistent with state law.

The Morgan School District will issue a certificate excusing a home-schooled minor from attendance. See reverse side for procedure for placing a home-school student transferring to a public school.

## **Additional Comments:**

### **Procedure for Placing a Home School Student Transferring to a Public School**

When a home school student transfers to a public school, the public school will place the student in the grade level, classes, or courses that the student's parent or guardian, in consultation with the school administrator, determine are appropriate based on the parent/guardian assessment of the student's academic performance. Within 30 days of a home school student's placement in a public school grade level, class, or course, either the student's teacher or the student's parent or guardian may request a conference to consider changing the student's placement. If the student's teacher and the student's parent or guardian agree on a placement change, the public school will place the student in the agreed upon grade level, class, or course. If the student's teacher and the student's parent or guardians do not agree on a placement change, the public school will evaluate the student's subject matter mastery.

The student's parent or guardian has the option of allowing the public school to administer, to the student, assessments that are regularly administered to public school students and used to measure public school students' subject matter mastery and determine placement or having a private entity or individual administer assessments of subject matter mastery to the student at the parent's or guardian's expense. After an evaluation of a student's subject matter mastery, a public school may change a student's placement in a grade level, class, or course.
