The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will determine eligibility for federal grants (PELL), work study and/or loans which may be used at colleges/ universities, and technology schools to cover expenses. The sooner the FAFSA is completed the better.

College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

The College-Level Examination Program enables students to earn college credit for what they already know, whether it was learned in school, through independent study or other experiences outside of the classroom. This allows students to save time and money. Most college/ universities now award credit for qualifying scores. The exams, 90 minutes in length and primarily multiple-choice, are administered at participating college/ universities. It is important that you contact the university that you will be attending to obtain a listing of CLEP Tests accepted at that university. www.eligibilitycenter.org or the NAIA Eligibility Center www.playnaia.org web site to learn about the courses, grade point average, and ACT scores that are required. There are many rules and regulations that prospective college student-athlete must adhere to: it is recommended that students and parents access the NCAA and/or NAIA web site beginning the

ninth grade year or even before. Every prospective student-athlete that has interest in participating in collegiate athletics must register with the NCAA and/or NAIA and submit the appropriate documents. Students that register through either NCAA or NAIA need to be aware that their ACT or SAT test scores must be sent directly to NCAA/NAIA from the ACT/SAT testing agency. When completing the ACT or SAT registration form, students must release scores to these entities. NAIA Code # 9876

ACCESS PROGRAM/Oklahoma's Promise

How would you like your son's/daughter's college tuition cost paid for? This may be possible if you apply and qualify. The Oklahoma's Promise/Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program (OHLAP) is open to any student in grades 8th—10th, whose parents earnings are \$55,000 or below. (Must use current income tax return.) The student agrees to take required courses and maintain certain grade point averages. The OHLAP application (which is easily completed) can be obtained from the counselor or at www.okhighered.org

Second Income Limit After graduation high school students receiving the award must again submit parent income which at that time must not exceed \$100,000.

after high school should take the National ACT or SAT at least once during their junior year. Students that qualify may use a "Fee Waiver", which allows them to take the ACT without any charge. Qualifying students may use a total of two fee waivers during their junior or senior years.

Four retired ACT test may be checked out to use in preparation for the ACT.
